
# Story Mountain overview

### Climax:

Show the BIG problem or exciting event.



### Rising Action:

Show what your characters are doing and build up to the problem.

# Exposition (Beginning):

Introduce your setting and characters

### Falling Action:

Show how the characters try to solve the problem and what happens next.

### Ending:

Show how everything finishes and how the characters feel.






# Build your main character

# The 5-part story frame

1

### Exposition (Beginning):

Introduce your setting and characters

2

### Rising Action:

Show what your character is doing and build up to the problem.

3

### Climax:

Show the BIG problem or exciting event.

4

### Falling Action:

Show how the character tries to solve the problem and what happens next.

5

### Ending:


Show how everything finishes and how the character feels.



# Path A: Story Summary — 4-6 sentences



1) Who + where (Exposition)



2) Want + problem (Rising Action)



3) BIG moment (Climax)



4) What they try / what happens next (Falling Action)



5) How it ends + feeling (Ending)



# Example Story Summary 1

### Secret Helper

You quietly fix something broken in your classroom. Who notices your kindness?



1) One morning, I saw the art shelf was broken.



2) I wanted to fix it before anyone got hurt.



3) I found tape and started fixing it quietly.



4) My teacher walked in and saw it was safe again.



5) She smiled and said, "Someone kind helped us today," and I felt proud.



# Example Story Summary 2

### Talking Snowman

Your snowman whispers your name. What secret does it want to share?



1) I built a snowman in my yard after the first big snowfall.



2) I wanted it to look special, but I forgot to give it a name.



3) Suddenly, it whispered, "Call me Frost!" and I jumped in surprise.



4) Frost told me a secret - his hat could make wishes come true for one night only.



5) I wished for my family to be together, and as the stars sparkled, my wish came true.



## Path B: Full Draft - About 500 words

- Around 500 words total do as much or as little as you can!
- Short sentences
- Use this order:

Beginning  $\rightarrow$  Build-up  $\rightarrow$  BIG moment  $\rightarrow$  Fixing it  $\rightarrow$  Ending + feeling















# Draft guide

- Beginning 2–3 lines
- Build-up 3–5 lines
- BIG moment 2-3 lines
- Fixing it 3–4 lines
- Ending + feeling 2-3 lines

# Show, don't tell

Tell  $\rightarrow$  The snow was cold.

Show → My fingers tingled as I packed a snowball.

Tell  $\rightarrow$  I felt excited for Christmas.

Show → My heart raced as I heard sleigh bells outside.

Swap one "tell" for a "show."

# What is a good image prompt?

#### What's a prompt?

It's the sentence that tells the app what to draw on this page.

Your main character stays the same—you change the action, place, and details.

#### The 4 Magic Parts (A-P-O-M)

- Action what is the character doing?
- Place where is it happening?
- Objects 1–2 things to include (props).
- Mood/Time how it feels (cozy, windy) or when (evening, rainy).



# Quick Example Image Prompts

#### **Good Prompt**

"Santa's sleigh glides over snowy rooftops at midnight; stars sparkle, and children

dream below."

#### **Not Good Prompt**

"Santa on a roof."

#### Why is this not a good prompt? Put your hand up

Remember The 4 Magic Parts (A-P-O-M)

Action + Place + Objects + Mood/Time



# Why is this a bad prompt?

#### **Not Good Prompt**

"Santa on a roof."

- Action No Action
- Place "Roof"
- Cobjects No Objects
- Mood/Time No Mood/Time

The bad prompt has not passed

the 4 magic parts!





# Why is this a good prompt?

#### **Good Prompt**

"Santa's sleigh glides over snowy rooftops at midnight; stars sparkle, and children dream below."

- Action "Glides over"
- Place "Snowy rooftops"
- Objects "Sleigh," "Stars"
- Mood/Time "Midnight"

The good prompt has passed

the 4 magic parts!


### What is A.I?


# Al = Artificial Intelligence.

- It means computers learn patterns from lots of examples.
- Then they use those patterns to help us: recognize voices, suggest words, translate,

draw pictures from words, and chat.







That's how your character was made!



#### In Build My Story, Al can:

- grow your summary into a story (Help me write)
- make pictures from your prompt (Create new image)

#### Remember!

Al is NOT a person. It has no feelings and can make mistakes.

YOU are the author — check, edit, and choose what to keep.

#### Story Summary → Big Story

#### Image Prompt →



#### Be smart & kind online:

- Don't share private info (full name, address, passwords).
- Ask an adult if something doesn't look right.
